The Collie (Rough & Smooth)

The Collie was originally bred for sheep herding in Scotland and Northern England but today the Collie's role is that of companion dog.

There are two varieties of the Collie, the **ROUGH** and the **SMOOTH**. The only difference is in the length of coat. The **SMOOTH** has a short, dense undercoat, required for insulation, and an outer coat that is straight, harsh, close to the body, and of sufficient length to cover the undercoat. The **ROUGH** also has the soft insulating undercoat, but it's outercoat is much longer. There is an abundance of hair around the neck, chest, belly and tail.

The Collie's coat gives him the needed protection from harsh weather and his body's structure allows for strength and agility, which enables him to work and play all day. This may explain why the Collie is a popular pet with children. The male usually weighs between 60 and 75 pounds and stands 24 to 26 inches, at the shoulder. The females weigh between 50 and 65 pounds and are usually shorter in height.

The Collie's sweet expression is obtained by the perfect balance and combination of skull, foreface, size, shape and placement of the eyes, as well as having the correct position and carriage of the ears. This combination gives the Collie a truly magnificent, noble and alert appearance.

Both smooth and rough, the Collie is a dignified, intelligent, loyal, and a friendly dog that many have come to love. It makes a strikingly handsome companion, and given adequate exercise, human companionship and proper training, is a thoroughly delightful addition to any family.

Far beyond the physical beauty of this breed lies a temperament that is hard to beat. A collie will and has risked its life to save family members (and even strangers) from such dangers as drowning, fires or on-rushing traffic. Their loyalty and love for their family goes far beyond words.

COLLIE COLOURS

Collies, both Rough and Smooth come in five different colours.

SABLE AND WHITE

which can range from sable to mahogany.

TRI is mostly black, with tan markings on the face and legs, and of course with the typical Collie white markings on the legs, chest, neck and tip of tail.

BLUE MERLE is usually silver-blue splashed with black, also having the tan and white markings as on the Tri..

SABLE MERLE, is very similar to the Sable and White, but is usually much lighter in colour. Some Blue or Sable Merles have blue flecks or blue eyes.

WHITE has a predominately white body but the head may be Tri, Sable or Blue Merle. There are no colour preferences in the show ring.

GROOMING TIPS!

A full coated Rough Collie might look like they need lots of grooming, but most owners find that 10 to 15 minutes once a week is all that is needed.

Modern grooming products help keep the coat clean and free of mats. Breeders are happy to teach new Collie owners how to keep their Collie dog looking great without much fuss.

Smooth Collies require even less grooming time.

1. This code shall establish a standard of conduct to be followed by all members of the Collie Club of British Columbia in the normal course of breeding, selling, exhibiting and judging collies. We recognize the difficulty of covering all situations and for this reason any failure to comply with the intent of this Code shall be handled in the same manner as a specific violation.
2. No member shall knowingly sell puppies or breeding stock to pet dealers, catalogue houses or other commercial sources; nor shall dogs be given as prizes in contests or exploited to the detriment of the breed.
3. All Collies sold shall be registerable. Registration papers shall be supplied to the buyer as soon as they are received by the member.
4. Any Collie sold shall be without defect to the degree that these defects shall not interfere with its normal function as a suitable pet or companion.
5. No collie shall knowingly be sold with communicable diseases or in poor condition.
6. All dogs offered at stud shall be in good health and free from communicable disease. Dogs known to be sterile or cryptorchids shall not be offered at stud. Bitches to be bred shall also be in good health and free from communicable disease. Stud owner shall inform customer of any disqualifying defects.
7. Bitch shall be bred only to selected stud. Owner of bitch is to be consulted before any other stud is used.
8. Only an actual witnessed tie shall be considered a breeding unless otherwise mutually agreed to by both parties.
9. All financial arrangements shall be made in advance of sales or service and agreed to by both parties.
10. All advertising shall be honest and not in any way misrepresentative or fraudulent.
11. Whether at home, traveling, at shows or motels, all members shall conduct themselves at all times in such a manner as to reflect credit on the dog show game and Collies in particular.
12. All members shall be shown a copy of the Code when joining and by the act of joining shall signify their acceptance of this Code in its entirety. Any members then violating this Code either in content or intent shall be punished according to the severity and intent of the violation up to and including expulsion from the Club.
13. An Ethics Committee consisting of four (4) members plus the President, shall hear all cases.
14. Members of the Ethics Committee shall serve for two (2) years and shall be voted in by Club membership
